How do I contact the OSTU People?!

All the folks who do OSTU work have a union email account.

It doesn't matter if the person changes, the contact information for the role stays the same.

Here's the list of emails for these OSTU roles:

President - Ip67@bctf.ca Pro-D Chair - pd67@bctf.ca 1st Vice-President - ostuvp@outlook.com Mentorship Coordinator - ostumentorship@outlook.com Please note: We do this work at the OSTU Office. The # is 250-492-4915.

It may help to save the contact as the name of the role rather than the name of the person. For example, in your contact list name the President email as "OSTU President" rather than "Alicia Moura." That way when I win the lottery and retire early, you can still email the same address to connect with the next Prez.

Reminder: the OSTU Prez is on leave from the school district to work fulltime at the OSTU office. So emailing or phoning my district accounts will not work as I don't monitor them.

"OSTU allocated days" is the code you use in Atrieve when booking. In the comments write "remedy in-lieu day."


Book these days ASAP as they won't roll-over and can't be gifted.
